

Examples of MLA - 7th Edition - Works Cited Entries

Since the seventh edition of the *MLA Handbook for Writers of Research Papers* is now out, you must follow the guidelines in it. The entries below include changes in the new edition as well as examples of many common entries. Note that you must add the word *Print* after printed materials. Note that you do NOT type URLs (web addresses); instead, include the word *Web*.

Book

Note that book titles should now be in italics. Do NOT underline titles.

Gale, David. *The Master of Announcements*. New York: Alfred A. Knopf, 1996. Print.

Book with Two or Three Authors or Editors

Danzig, Maureen G., Rine E. Eustis, and Anne H. Jackson, eds. *Anthropology of Grade Deans: Interdisciplinary Multilevel Modeling*. Amsterdam: John Benjamins, 2007. Print.

Book with More Than Three Authors

Give the first author's name only followed by *et al.* ("and others").

Zambetti, Katharine L., et al. *English Linguistics Made Simple*. Berlin: Mouton, 2007. Print.

Book with Author and Editor

Gale, David. *The Master of Announcements*. Ed. Eileen V. Thurmond. New York: Alfred A. Knopf, 1996. Print.

Book with No Author

The Holy Bible. Wheaton: Patty Roberts Publications, 2003. Print. English Standard Version.

Book with Corporate Author

National Geographic. *Beyond Six Billion: Forecasting the World's Population*. Washington: Natl. Geog., Inc., 2000. Print.

Book Published in a Second or Subsequent Edition

Scholarly Publication (Journal)

Newspaper Article

NOTE: Immediately following the title of the newspaper, you must add the name of the city in which the newspaper is published, in brackets, unless it is obvious from the title of the newspaper.

Nonperiodical Publication - ONLY ON THE WEB

For nonperiodical publications, that are only on the web, include both the name of the website in italics (do NOT underline titles) and the name of the website publisher. Note that some sites have names different than their print formats, such as ones that include a domain name like *.com* or *.org*. If no publisher is listed, use *N. p.* to denote that no publisher name is given. Follow with date of publication, *Web* as the medium of publication, and the date of access.

Online-only Publication

For articles that appear in an online-only format or in databases that do not provide a page number, use the abbreviation *n. pag.* to denote no pagination. List the publication medium as *Web*. Add the date of access.

Online Scholarly Project

Names of online scholarly projects appear in italics. Difficult-to-find projects may be listed in quotation marks. Add the website name and domain in italics. The publication location and date follow. List *Web* as the publication medium. Give date of access.

To avoid typing the URL, add the photograph identification number from the URL.

Untitled Image - Photograph - Unidentified Photographer - From a Specific Web Site and Publisher

If the photograph does not have a title, give the photograph a title to identify the content; enclose your title in quotation marks. Give the name of the web site in italics, give the name of the web site publisher, and give the date of publication.

(Note that for the first database listed below, published by ABC-CLIO, the *name of the section of the database* is written in italics, but the name of the database publisher is written in regular type.)
